SAMPLE LETTER KANSAS CITY AREA LEVEE DISTRICTS

Dear XXXXXXXXXXXXXX,

Opening up the Missouri and Kaw Rivers to allow citizens to enjoy the rivers as historic, scenic, natural, and recreational attractions has been a goal of the region's leaders and citizens for many years.

The simplest and most inexpensive way to accomplish this is to allow walking and bicycling trails to be built in riverfront areas.

Missouri law allows and encourages levee districts to work together with trail building organizations to develop, build, and maintain bikeways and bike trails. Missouri Code Chapter 246 (Provisions Relating to All Drainage and Levee Districts) Section 283 states:

Any district formed pursuant to the laws of this state shall have authority to cooperate with other entities, public and private, in the development of bikeways and hike trails . . .

I understand and acknowledge that there are financial and engineering challenges to building trails on and near levee areas. However, levee districts in areas like Council Bluffs, Iowa, Salina, Kansas, Louisville, Kentucky, and St. Louis, Missouri have been able to deal with these problems successfully. I hope that you will work with trail building organizations and trail advocates in the Kansas City area so that we, too, can successfully overcome these problems.

Creating a riverfront trails system in the Kansas City area will have these benefits for levees and the areas protected by them:

- Creating levee trails makes the riverfront areas more attractive to potential
 residents, employees, and employers. This helps spur development and economic
 activity, making these areas more productive and sustainable and improving the
 levee district's ability to collect the drainage and levee taxes needed to maintain
 the levees.
- Allowing trails to be built on and near levees means that trail funding sources can be used to help mitigate existing problems where trails are built--for instance to take measures to solve erosion problems in areas where trails are built.
- Public use of the riverfront areas will build public support for the large
 amounts of federal funding that will be needed to improve the levees and
 protect vulnerable riverfront areas. The networks of contacts and support you
 will build in working with cities, counties, metropolitan planning
 organizations, and community groups in building trails will also serve you
 well in building the political support needed to secure federal funding for
 levee improvement.

I urge and encourage XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX to work with trail-building groups in the Kansas City area to allow trails to be built in levee areas. Creating a complete trail network is an identified regional priority that impacts health, tourism, and economic development across the entire metropolitan area. Access to levee areas and the riverfront is a key and irreplaceable aspect of the planned trail system and an important missing element in our effort to make Kansas City a truly world-class city.
