



A Message from America's Retired Generals, Admirals and Civilian Military Leaders:

As retired Generals, Admirals, and other senior leaders of the United States Armed Forces, we know firsthand that national security must be America's top priority.

Our organization recently released a report citing Department of Defense data indicating that an alarming 75 percent of all young Americans 17 to 24 years of age are unable to join the military because they failed to graduate from high school, have criminal records, or are physically unfit.

Being overweight or obese turns out to be the leading medical reason why applicants fail to qualify for military service. Today, otherwise excellent recruit prospects, some of them with generations of sterling military service in their family history, are being turned away because they are just too overweight.

Bussing Costs

- 14.7 billion annual costs
- ~5% of average school budget



Traffic

- As walking to school has declined 50→15%,
 private automobile travel has increased
- As much as 20% of rush hour traffic
- Traffic Danger (self fulfilling prophecy)



Individual barriers to walking and bicycling to school

Long distances 62%

• Traffic danger 30%

Adverse weather 19%

• Fear of crime danger 12%

Evolution of PedNet's Program

- 2003-present: Walk-to-School Days
- Spring, 2005: Pilot WSB program (4 routes, 30 children, parent-led)
- Spring, 2006: Formal WSB program (12 routes, 120 children, volunteer-led)
- Spring, 2010: WSB at 11 schools (40 routes, 450 children, 120 volunteers)

What People Should Know

- Paid WSB Coordinator
- School Based Liaisons



Responsibilities of Coordinator

- Market program, register families
- Recruit, train, and coordinate volunteers
- Evaluate, plan WSB routes




Walking School Bus Coordinator (All Programs)


Single Bus Leader

Responsibilities of School Based Liaison

- Be at the school when WSB arrives
- Discipline, call parents etc
- Day to day volunteer
- 3-5 hours per week


