- Making the community more green




"...brings together all key community stakeholders to work to identify barriers to active transportation around schools and develop a written plan of action for dealing with those challenges."

- SRTS legislated in California, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Oregon, Texas, Washington
- STP's required in Illinois, Oklahoma, Ohio, Virginia, New Hampshire, New Mexico, South Carolina, Wyoming
- STP models in Connecticut, Vermont, Oregon, Texas, Wisconsin



Differences

- More comprehensive approach
- More time spent thinking through each step
- Forced to pull together a group to look at specific local issues
- More community-based
